

Tips for using tourniquets



How To

- 1. Place the tourniquet 5 to 10 cm above the injecting site.
- 2. You should be able to comfortably fit two fingers side by side under the tourniquet once it's tied.
- 3. If you feel your hand or arm going numb/turning blue, the blood supply has been cut off. Remove the tourniquet, reapply when ready to inject as long as feeling and colour has returned.
- 4. If the tourniquet has been tied for longer than 3 minutes release it and allow blood flow to get going again.
- **5.** Release the tourniquet before injecting.

Pro Tips

 Keeping the tourniquet tied while injecting can cause MISSED HITS and LOSS OF TASTE due to added vein pressure.

- 2. DON'T SHARE TOURNIQUES, this can lead to Blood Borne Virus i.e. HIV or Hep C.
- **3.** Use a marker to help identify your tourniquet.
- **4.** Rubber Tourniquet are SINGLE USE only.
- 5. To remove bacteria clean the tourniquet by wiping down the length with a swab. Use a new swab per wipe.
